Name: Claire Matata

Where do you work? I work with the Brain

Infections UK group in Liverpool, with my post being funded by the Royal Liverpool and Broadgreen Hospitals Trust.

What is your job/role? Research Nurse.

What is your background? (e.g. where were you born, university, jobs/work to date etc etc...) I was born and grew up in Shrewsbury, Shropshire. I started off by doing a History degree at Aberystwyth University; then joined the British Army, where I met my fiancé Andrew. After coming out of the Army, I did my Adult Nursing degree at Liverpool University. I'd actually thought about doing my nurse training for a while before I actually got round to it! I loved my nurse training, and had some really good tutors who inspired my interest in research. Before becoming a research nurse I was lucky enough to get some really good nursing experiences. I've worked in thoracic surgery, prison nursing, and community nursing. All of these jobs were challenging in their own way, but I enjoyed all of them and learnt lots. 
Fax issues

Apologies again about the lack of fax. We are looking into it and hope to have it fixed soon. You can fax enrolments to 0151 795 5528 but CRFs should be sent or scanned and e-mailed due to the size of them.

Reminder time

- We need more patients recruited <u>prior to LP</u> in order to get some extra CSF for the substudies – please remember if you are based on an acute medical ward
- We need more patients with **TB meningitis** remember they are eligible too
- Don't forget to check the <u>HSV type specific serology</u> on patients with HSV meningitis
- Don't forget to offer an <u>HIV test</u> to all patients with meningitis
- Encourage juniors/ward staff to make sure <u>concurrent glucose</u> is done (whether in the study or not)
- Encourage <u>full viral PCR work up</u> in cases of aseptic meningitis, including stool and throat PCR for enterovirus
- Remember to ask patients if they would be willing to self take <u>genital swabs</u> if they have aseptic meningitis
- Remember to ask patients about **genital lesions** past and present.
- For patients who have consented to substudies please try and make sure the patient had
 the <u>PAXgene sample taken as soon as possible</u> preferably within 48 hours of admission.
- Remember to take the <u>second PAXgene sample</u> at 3-5 days/discharge.

A few Results – from the first 100 patients (data available on 85/100)



- 5 cases of HSV-2 meningitis, one had concurrent genital lesions, none had previous genital disease, **none had type specific serology done.**
- Only 42/85 patients had a concurrent glucose done at the time of LP
- Only 39% of patients with meningitis getting an HIV test.
- Only 3 patients recruited prior to LP
